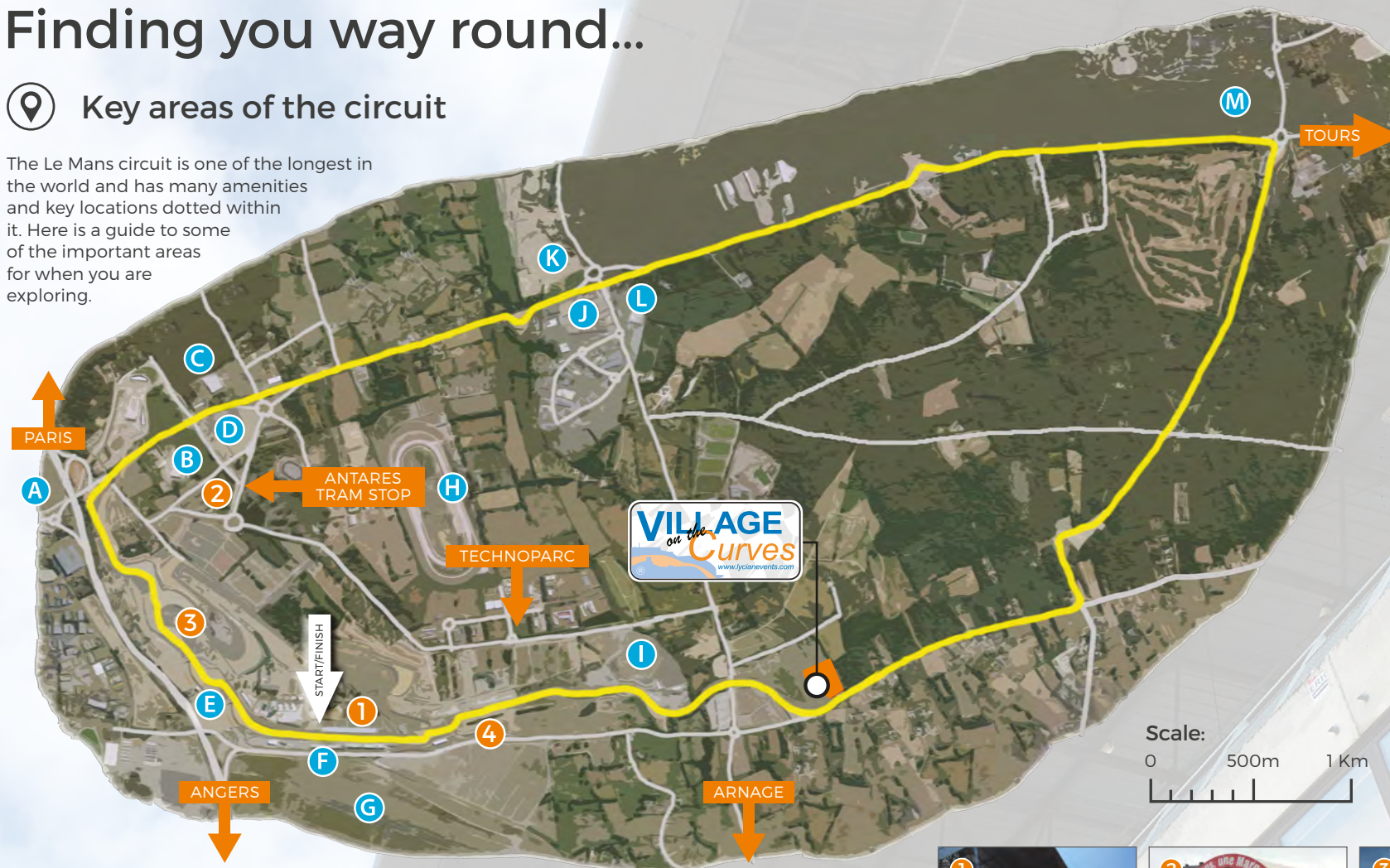


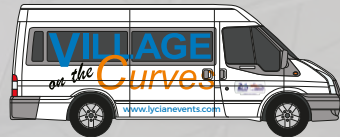
Finding your way round...

Take the tram

The tram is the best way to visit Le Mans for the drivers parade. It runs from 05:30hrs to 01:00hrs and takes around 20 minutes to the city centre (Republique). The best place to catch the tram is from Antares Sud, the cost is €1.50 per journey.
