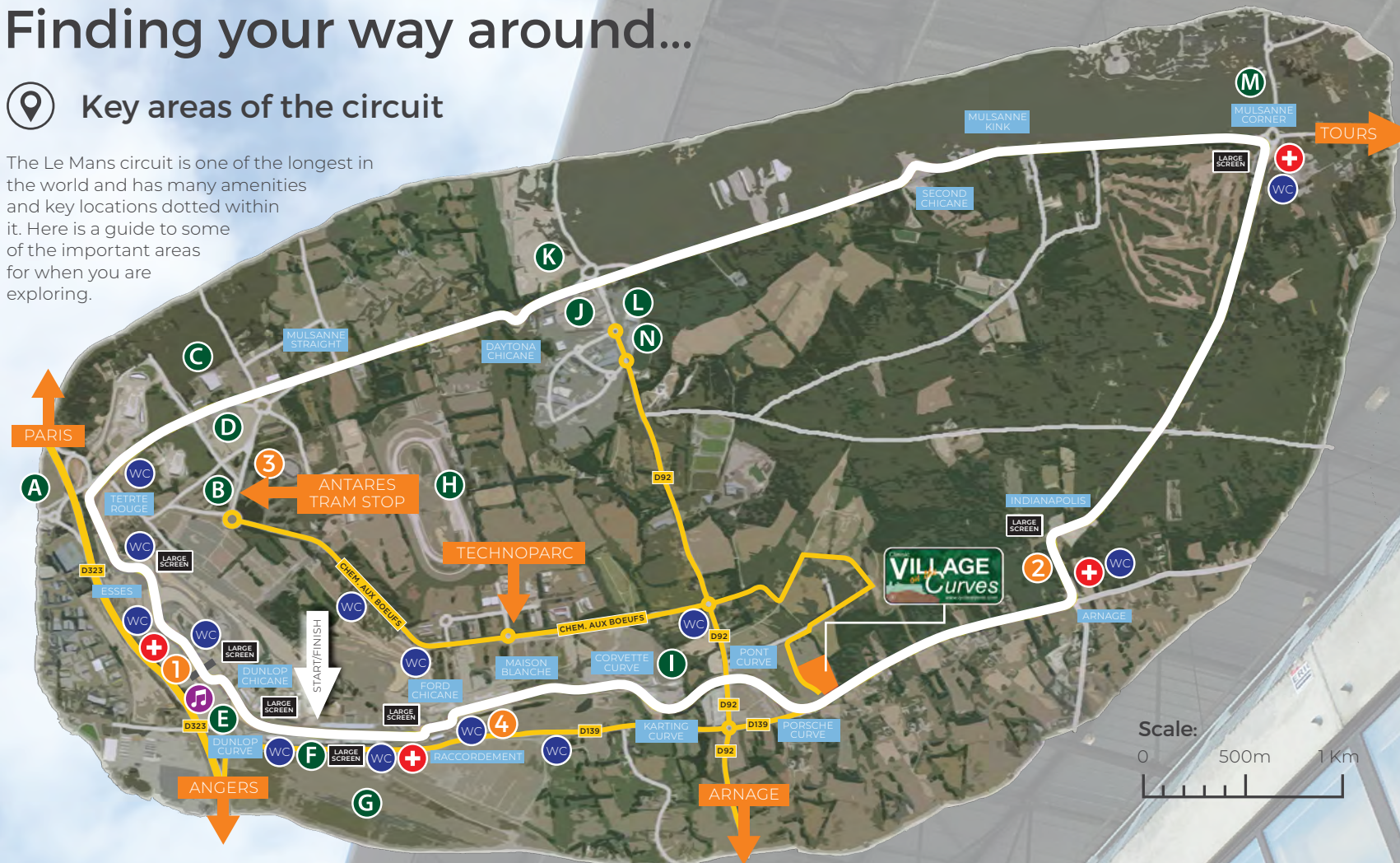


Finding your way around...

Key areas of the circuit

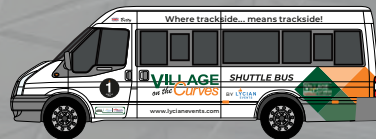
The Le Mans circuit is one of the longest in the world and has many amenities and key locations dotted within it. Here is a guide to some of the important areas for when you are exploring.

The tram is the best way to visit Le Mans for the drivers parade. It runs from 05:30hrs to 01:00hrs and takes around 20 minutes to the city centre (Republique). The best place to catch the tram is from Antres Sud.
